In NIL news, Duke freshman Cooper Flagg, expected to be the #1 pick in the 2025 NBA Draft, secured a sponsorship deal with Gatorade. Reflecting on the partnership, Cooper shared, "This has been a big year for me on and off the court, and Gatorade has been there the whole way. From being named the Gatorade Best Male Player of the Year to now officially joining the team, it's been surreal to have my name mentioned with some of the biggest names in basketball." As Cooper's season with Duke begins, he's hopeful this will be a big step toward his NBA dream.

Oklahoma football, meanwhile, is having a tough season with quarterback questions, a lack of first-string receivers, and the challenges of joining the SEC. OU legend Barry Switzer voiced concerns about the challenges Oklahoma faces in recruiting compared to a large state like Texas. He also shared reservations about the influence of NIL on college sports, a sentiment shared by many of the older generation.

In other NIL news, BYU is in the running to secure the #1 high school recruit of 2025, AJ Dybantsa, a 6'9" player from Brockton, Massachusetts, with a projected NIL package of \$4 million. With the backing of the Utah Jazz owner, BYU hopes to land the commitment, even though he may only be there for one year.
