The 1.5-inch decals, featuring players' names and numbers, would have been visible on TV broadcasts and social media, even though they wouldn't be seen from the stands. Instead, the QR code appeared on the 6,160-square-foot video board at Boone Pickens Stadium.

Chad Weiberg, OSU Athletic Director, commented, "Our team developed an innovative concept to enhance the NIL value of our student-athletes, but it highlights how college sports are evolving faster than the rulebook."

While OU players benefit from NIL earnings, walk-ons often struggle with expenses like schooling and housing. Danny Stutsman, a senior linebacker on scholarship, decided to donate \$50,000 of his NIL earnings to his walk-on teammates. He wanted to show appreciation for their commitment and hard work.

In another exciting development for women's sports, University of Texas volleyball star Madisen Skinner signed an NIL deal with HEB, a Texas grocery store chain. Through this partnership, she will support local schools and contribute \$10,000 to Brighter Bites, a Texas nonprofit tackling childhood hunger. Madisen's impact extends beyond the court, making a difference in her community.
